COVID-19 Pandemic Update

April 1, 2020

We currently have a total of 9 laboratory-confirmed cases, and we continue to update this number daily on the Town's website. Information we receive on positive cases comes to us from the State Department of Public Health (DPH). At this time, we are following the direction of DPH that states that we are permitted to release "information on total number of positive cases without patient level specifics." We have asked the State for further clarification regarding what additional information, if any, may be shared.

Some additional updates:

- Effective immediately, all parking facilities at Wolfe Park and Great Hollow Lake will be restricted to Monroe residents and taxpayers. Vehicles must have the blue valid park sticker issued last spring, or show identification with a Monroe address. Fishing licenses will continue to be honored at Great Hollow Lake. Remember that all use of our parks must follow social distancing requirements.
- The Garder Road Landfill remains open as scheduled and will now be accepting brush and wood in addition to leaves, grass, scrap metal, and electronic recycling. There will be no charge, however there is a limit of one trip per day.
- Businesses that wish to display a portable sign that meets our zoning regulations may do so immediately during their hours of business operations without the need for a permit.
