#### UPDATES

- The state rules regarding masks or cloth face coverings have been revised as follows:
  - Employees that cannot wear a mask due to a medical condition must provide documentation to their employer.
  - Businesses have the right to refuse service to an individual not wearing a mask.
  - If an individual declines to wear a mask or cloth face covering because of a medical condition as described above, such person shall be required to produce medical documentation verifying the stated condition.

#### IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- Reminders on certain other state rules that remain in effect:
  - Private social gatherings remain limited to 25 indoors and 100 outdoors.
  - Outdoor organized events limited to 500 people with 15 feet of space “blanket to blanket.”
  - Residents returning from travel from certain states must submit a travel health form and self-quarantine for 14 days. Further information available at <https://portal.ct.gov/Coronavirus/travel>. The state has fined 7 individuals \$1,000 each for failure to complete the form and/or to self-quarantine.
